## LEBANON WRESTLING HOPING FOR STATE TROPHIES IN 2020

## 'Jackets and Lady 'Jackets return 11 total state qualifiers

It has long been the most consistent sport year in and year out at Lebanon High School, and this year will be no different for the Lebanon wrestling team.

With over 80 boys on the roster this season, head coach Randy Roark is excited to get the season going after not accomplishing their goals last season, despite qualifying nine boys for the state tournament.

"We were wanting to bring home a state trophy last year and didn't doit," said Roark of last year's team. "Hopefully, this year is the year for the boys."

The girls' wrestling team won the first state championship in school history for Lebanon in the inaugural season of the MSHSAA girls state tournament and return every wrestler from the first-place team

A lot of high school teams would be lucky to have two wrestlers at all 14 weight classes, but Roark and the Yellowjackets are three deep at each class on the boys' side. Below are the wrestlers who could or are expected to see varsity time.

106: Jonathan Perryman and Quentin Long are two freshmen that have both wrestled seven years in the USA program. "They are coming in with good experience," Roark said.

113: Sophomore Josiah Perryman and freshman Taydem Johnson. "Josiah was our starter at 106-pounds last year and is a solid wrestler," Roark mentioned. "Taydem is another kid who has a lot of experience in USA wrestling."

120: Freshman Davis Joiner and sophomore Bo Rosen. "Bo was our varsity guy at 120 last year and was a match away from going to state," Roark said. "Davis is a third-year wrestler and is solid. He is a USA wrestler, also."

126: Junior Cole Patten (State Qualifier) and senior Austin Johnson. "Cole was a state qualifier last year and took that next step that he needed to take, now he just needs to remain consistent," stated Roark. "These two have wrestled the last three years for this spot, and Austin is a good wrestler."

132: Senior Hayden Dearborn and senior Zach Miller. "Dearborn has been in and out of the varsity lineup for the last two years," he said. "Miller is undefeated in high school since wrestling on the JV, so we are looking forward to watching him."

138: Senior Cole Roark (3x State Qualifier) and freshman Jason Evers. "Jason is a Joel E. Barber boy and is pretty scrappy," said Roark. "Cole just needs confidence. He just needs to know he's as good as

anybody in that weight bracket."

145: Junior Elijah Are and sophomore Sam Davidson. "Elijah was a point away from making the state tournament," Roark said. "Sam was a JV guy who had a solid year last season."

152: Freshman Cade Muscia and sophomore Robert Garner. "Robert was on and off last year in the varsity lineup," Roark said. "Muscia is a multiple time USA state champ with a lot of experience, so he will be nice to have."

160: Senior Trevor Christian (3x State Medalist) and sophomore Connor Brand. "Connor got a few matches and was like 6-4 on varsity," Roark said. "Trevor is a tough, hard-working kid. Through youth

wrestling, he wasn't the best. He's worked his way into what he is now and recently signed with Drury."

170: Junior Colt Adkins (State Qualifier) and sophomore Colt Heisz. "Adkins is driven and has attended a lot of camps over the summer to get ready for this season," stated Roark. "Heisz got about ten matches on varsity last year."

182: Junior Jake Henson (State Qualifier) and junior Gabriel Schiller. "Schiller was a JV guy the past couple years and has been a USA wrestler for a long time," Roark said. "Henson replaced Ty Glendenning and did well for us."





195: Senior Landen Smith (State Qualifier) and sophomore Sam Cooper. "Landen had a solid year last season and went 1-2 at the state tournament, so we are hoping to turn the tide for him this year," mentioned Roark. "Sam got a couple of matches in on varsity last year and is a good wrestler."

220: Junior Kael Ruble and freshman Jaden Hubler. "Kale lost a little weight to get down to 220," Roark said. "Jaden has six or seven years of USA wrestling under his belt and is a multiple-time state medalist for USA wrestling."

285: Junior Garrett Childers and junior Hunter Henry. "I think Garrett was about 7-3 in varsity matches last year. He is a solid kid," said Roark. "Hunter was an exhibition guy last year, but came up with a big win in wrestle-offs to put himself into this position."

On the girls' side, as mentioned above, they return everyone from their state championship squad from 2018-19, but they know the target will be on their back this winter.

The key returners include state champion Quincey Glendenning (130), state runner-up Dream Cunningham (135), and state medalists Ashlynn Leochner (116) and Talora Frisbee (152).

"Our girls know that the target will be on their back this year," Roark stated. "Quincey is tough and a solid wrestler.

"Ashlynn, Talora, and Dream are working hard to get back to Colum-

bia in February and are hoping to do more this year."

Multiple girls were a match away from making it to state, but now every district will take the top four to state instead of the top three.

The rest of the roster includes McKenzie Gomely (103), Emily Young and Rayley Sutton (110), Meadow Miller (116), Adeline Cottingin, Chloe Shearer and Kathryn Buckner (121), Rae White (131), Darby Neeley, Ashley Young and Taylor Johnson (136), Amy Anderson, Josie Denton and Bailey Joiner (143), Ariana Carrasquilla (152), Bailey Shockley, Leanna Christian and Shelby Davis (167), Carolyn Sterner (187) and MaKenna Lucas and Marissa Martin at 235.

In their first match of the season on December 3, the wrestling team defeated the Jefferson City Jays on the road, 41-27.

Varsity winners included Johnathan Perryman (106), Josiah Perryman (113), Davis Joiner (120), Cole Patten (126), Zach Miller (132), Cole Roark (138), Colt Adkins (170), Jake Henson (182), and Landen Smith (195).

JV winners were Taydem Johnson (113), Bo Rosen (120), Austin Johnson (126), Hayden Dearborn (132), Robert Garner (152), Gabriel Schiller (182), Sam Cooper (195), and Kael Ruble (220).

The wrestling team will have their first home meet on December 10 against Ozark beginning at 5:30 p.m. at the Fieldhouse.

## **LEBANON BASKETBALL HOPING FOR BACK-TO-BACK WINNING SEASONS**

For the first time in ten years, the Lebanon High School boys' basketball team recorded their first winning season. In his first year as head coach, Bill Brown led the Yellowjackets to a 14-11 record and graduated only two seniors from the team.

"I thought last year was an excellent starting point for us," said

Brown. "We were able to put in a lot of my philosophies and establish a work ethic on defense that by the end of the year, we were playing strong on both ends of the floor.

"This year, with our returners and our JV going through a year last year, we are so much further ahead than we were last year. We are working more in-depth on our defense, and I look forward to pushing the ball this year because I feel like we are strong at the guard position and forward position, so if we can rebound the ball, I think we can score more points this season."

Lebanon is coming off a loss in the Missouri Class 5 District 10 championship game to Camdenton, 59-47.

"I think that game was just an experience that we had to go through," Brown mentioned. "Playing in a hostile environment at Camdenton, they had us down 14-2 before we even woke up and got back in the game, and I thought once we got through the nerves, we played solid, but just ran out of juice."

Returning to the hardwood for the 'Jackets this winter will be a name

many fans are familiar with in senior guard Quenton Shelton. Entering his senior year, he has close to 2,000 points and averaged 20.1 PPG and 6.1 RPG as a junior. He currently holds offers from Southwest Baptist, Oklahoma Christian, and Quincy.

Other key returners include senior Ethan Christal (10. 3 PPG, 4.2 RPG), senior Jordan Lewis (7.3 PPG, 2.8 RPG), and senior Bryson Crowell (3.3 PPG) to help lead Lebanon this winter.


"Right now, Bryson Crowell is the strongest player we have on the floor in regards to defense, and he has grown some this summer," Brown said. "He is playing great defense and being a leader, as are the other three seniors."

## Ryan Toombs leads Conway Bears as new head coach

A familiar face for southwest Missouri basketball fans will be on the sideline for the Conway Bears boys' basketball team this winter as former Lebanon assistant coach, and former Niangua head coach Ryan Toombs takes over for long-time coach Jeff Coper.

"We want to establish a culture where kids love to be part of the basketball team," he mentioned. "That starts at the younger levels, and we have had outstanding support from our Athletic Director, Clay Bilyeu, in running our youth basketball league. It has had a tremendous response in terms of interest. Our players have been coaching and refereeing those games and have done an outstanding job.

"The goal is to make kids excited about basketball, so they will want to play more. We also want Conway Bears Basketball to be more than an event that community members attend a few times a year. We want our kids to serve as role models to the younger generation and make those youngsters and their parents proud to be associated with our basketball program."

Bears fans will get to watch a plethora of returners from last year's team in senior Colby Vavruksa, James Shockley (All-District), Ryder Berger, and Andrew Dame.

Vavruska earned All-Conference honors and was a KJEL All-Star and will be leaned on for leadership roles, according to Toombs.

"He is quick with the ball in his hands and is capable of creating shots for himself and his teammates," Toombs said of Vavruska.

"(Shockley) is naturally strong and athletic and gives us a guy who can defend size and attack the rim," he said. "(Berger) gives us a second point guard who has picked up on things quickly, and Dame returns for his second year of varsity action and has bought into his role as a three and

Conway will have a solid junior class coming in after a 12-14 season in 2018-19, including Jake Vestal, Kory McBride, Chase Caffey, Trey Earls, Alton Mackey, Devon Alexander, and Blake Mepham.

"Jake Vestal is a glass eater. Not many kids embrace rebounding their own position, and he can rebound multiple positions. He does a great job of understanding body positioning, reading the ball off the rim, and pursuing it hard," Toombs said. "Chase Caffey is an extremely hard worker on the defensive end who can also really fill it up from the perimeter. Kory McBride and Trey Earls are two high character guys who work extremely hard on the defensive end and shoot the ball well. Sophomore Blake Mepham will be asked to fill a unique role as a JV point guard and varsity back-up post. I'm excited about Alton Mackey when he can get healthy. He's a good interior presence who can also stretch the floor with his shooting ability.

"Devon Alexander is a guy who has really shown me something in practice so far and could force his way into the varsity rotation as he continues to develop. We should have excellent depth at our disposal on nights that we need to dig into our bench."

Toombs understands that they have to learn a lot of new concepts from scratch. Still, the varsity experience the team has should help them continue to improve throughout the season, and he said their goal is to compete hard in every drill and on every possession.

"Our strengths are our experience and competitive drive," he mentioned. "When we do a competitive drill in practice, it gets pretty intense. Our guys care about winning practice drills, which is very encouraging for when the lights come on for game day.

Juniors Tyler Williamson (4.3 PPG), Caleb Falzone, Colin Higbee, Josh Napper, and transfer Austin Fry are also expected to contribute this winter.

"They set a great base for our future," Brown said. "Once we get everyone healthy, we will have the ability to play all nine of those guys, so it will give our junior varsity a chance to improve without any pressure.

"I think the program is in a great spot."

Brown also mentioned that his expectations for this group would be high after finishing in the top half of the Ozark Conference a year ago, and the team will also host the Missouri Class 5 District 10 tournament this year in a field that features Glendale, Ozark, and Wavnesville.

"I think our schedule is pretty difficult with us playing all of the Springfield schools besides Central at their place," he stated. "If we can hold our own here at home and win our conference games here, I think we can sneak into Springfield and win a few games and challenge the other schools for a conference championship.

"We are going to host districts, so that gives us a better chance of excelling during that time, and Ozark will be tough, as will the other two schools, but we will host them here, so I feel confident with that."'

During press time, Lebanon was 1-0 to start the season with a come-frombehind win over St. Puis X, 59-58 at the Current River Challenge at Van Buren High School.

Lebanon will host Marshfield on December 10 for their home-opener with the freshmen starting at 4:30 p.m with the JV and varisty to follow.

"That will need to continue throughout the season for us to get better and reach our highest potential for success on the court."

Also, joining Toombs on the sidelines will be former Lebanon standout Connor Hicks. Hicks served as a Kickapoo

assistant coach last winter and was a four-year member of the SBU football team.

"We are thrilled to have Connor Hicks join us as the assistant varsity and head JV coach," Toombs said of Hikcs. "Connor was part of Kickapoo's program as an Assistant Coach last season and got to be part of their deep playoff run at the highest level of high school basketball. He had a great playing career at Lebanon and SBU (Football) and brings energy and experience.

"He's a young guy who is on fire for

coaching kids and making an impact. The season has barely started, and I can already tell he is going to help raise our level of basketball."

During press time, Conway was 0-2 to start the season with losses to Plato (87-72) and Crane (66-33).

## **L**EBANON GIRLS' BASKETBALL FEATURES YOUNG SQUAD

For the second time in three seasons, the Lebanon girls' basketball team won a district championship. This time, it was under legendary head coach Jacky Payne, who returns to the sideline for his 38th year.

Lebanon finished 2018-19 with a 16-11 overall record before falling to Columbia-Rock Bridge 54-46 at State Fair Community College on March 6.

"I thought we had a really good year last year, and probably could've had a great year," said Payne. "I think we were competitive and played a fun, up-tempo style of basketball that our players and fans liked.

"I thought there were four games that could've gone our way, but we started peaking around districts. I still have nightmares about the Rock Bridge game. We jumped on them early ... basically, a four-point game with two minutes left, and we had a great chance to get them, but it didn't go our way."

The Lady 'Jackets say goodbye to five key seniors, including Abby O'Connor, Faith Campbell, Kamryn Mack, Skylyr Leake, and Baylei Palmer.

Despite losing the key seniors, Payne's expectations remain high for a young but talented group.

"My expectations won't change regardless of who we have on the court," he said. "Our No. 1 goal is to win the state championship, and then we set primary goals to accomplish first.

"This will be one of the youngest teams I have ever coached."

Returning for Lebanon this winter will be First Team All-Ozark Confer-

ence selection Jenna Glendenning, who tied the school record for three-point percentage, shooting a stellar 44 percent in 18-19.

"She can do a lot of things," Payne said of the senior Glendenning. "She's all over the place and has such a coachable attitude. She's so well-respected by her teammates and area coaches."

Besides her, Katie Mino will be the other senior on the year team. Mino was a mix between varsity and junior varsity last season.

"She has really improved her game," Payne said. "She is a great lady and gets along well with the whole team.

"I think we have two quality seniors this year to help lead us.

Sophomore Makayah Alexander is a returning varsity player this year after a significant role player last year.

"She had a couple of games where she scored in double figures," Payne mentioned. "She can rebound and run the floor, but I think her passing is probably the most improved aspect of her game.

"She battled a couple of injuries on her foot over the summer, but she loves the game and is passionate."
